- Bikes in classrooms - promoting movement
- Optimized Outdoor spaces -
 - Athletics - fields,
 - track ok - could use concessions/snack, press box, announcements, etc
 - Playgrounds - existing is good and iconic but not accessible (closed often) improve access and opportunities
 - Community use -
 - trails (cross country)
 - Fitness equipment
 - Outdoor classrooms/multipurpose spaces for community use & outside organizations
 - Provide shelters/cover from the elements to promote independent and group learning.
- **Natural Lighting within facilities**
- Modernized furniture
- Spaces to socialize & gather
- Flexible spaces - ability for students to collaborate in ways that align with their learning styles and preferences.
- Kitchens - how can we deliver nutritional choices/options for students - engaging them with
